About the course

To optimise the classroom functioning of students with disabilities, school-based occupational therapists use their distinct knowledge base and address a variety of behavioral, neurological or sensory/motor issues. However, students with disabilities generally spend the majority of their educational time in classrooms with educators. It is important to prepare educators to enhance classroom learning, by applying strategies developed by therapists to meet the unique needs of individual students. This lecture series will address several topics (including Classroom behavior management, Sensory Integration, and Written productivity) to help educators understand the underpinnings of the interventions offered by occupational therapy. The fundamentals of inter-professional collaboration, and the importance of systematic application of classroom strategies that mitigate classroom difficulties will be discussed.

By the end of the lecture series, the participants will develop a plan to:

- Observe student function and document at least 2 pertinent classroom behaviors' that impede learning.
- Create a student referral that includes collecting data that concisely describes a student need.
- Integrate within their classroom routine, 3 strategies prescribed by an occupational therapist to address specific needs of a student.
- Provide feedback on the impact of the therapeutic interventions in the classroom.
