## 5.3.2 Documentary evidence for the Cultural events during the year 2019-20

## 1. SESSION ON PERFORMING ARTS




minutes each. The faculty also participated in the session. They were ably conducted under the guidance of the director of Physical Education, Mr. Clifton Fernandes.


## 10. CHRISTMAS DAY







The main objectives for undertaking this gala event were as follows:


•To provide a platform to celebrate and showcase the creative potential of our talented teacher trainees;




holistic education. The programme ended at 4.30p.m. with everyone present singing the Nirmala Anthem in unison.

#### 1. 7TH INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA - 21ST JUNE 2021



# 6. PERFORMING ART ACTIVITY -STREET PLAYS FOR MGNCRE








## 2. Street Play-'Atmanirbhar Bharat AniSwayampurna Goenchi Aajchi Naarishakti''


#### 4. Essay writing Competition



#### 17. ENGLISH DAY




to distribute. It was a great experience which was executed well by all team members with the help of our mentor Mrs Anagha Deshpande.


programme ended up at 4:45 pm.






#### 13. World Art Day




#### 14. Maths Day

To celebrate Geography Day the S.Y.B.Ed. teacher trainees of Nirmala Institute of Education conducted an event named Solinox which highlighted the






